



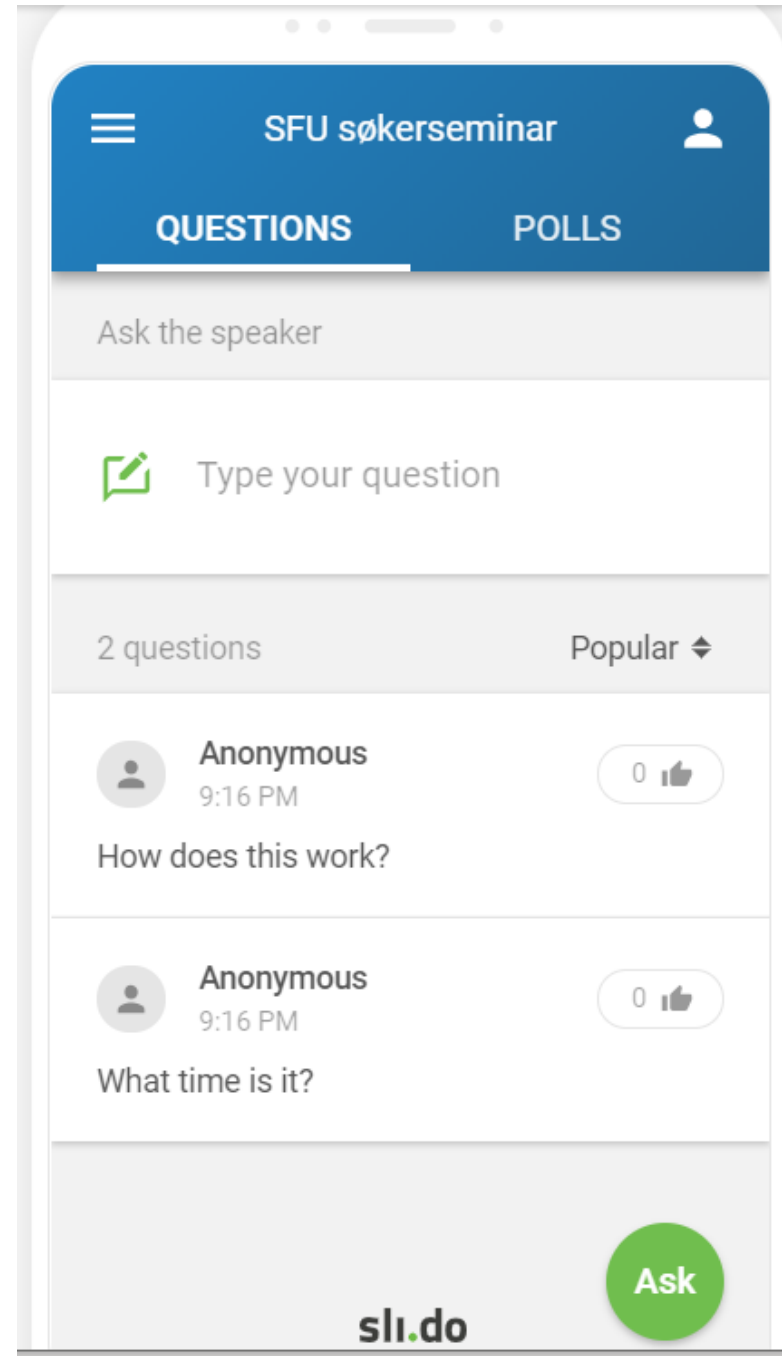

Centres for Excellence in Education

The SFU initiative shall:

- stimulate universities and university colleges to establish and develop academic communities that offer excellent education
- contribute to knowledge-based analysis and development of teaching and learning that underpins quality enhancement and innovation capable of making significant impact
- contribute to sector-wide development and dissemination of knowledge and excellent educational practices
- contribute to stronger interaction between higher education and relevant societal and professional fields

Call for proposals 2019



- Award 3-6 new centres
- 4-8 million NOK annually for five years
- Application deadline 29 April at 12:00
- Expert panel evaluate applications

- Universities, specialized universities and university colleges may apply
- Consortia: host institution and partners
- Associated partners and international partners may be included

Assessment criteria



- I. Documented quality in existing teaching and education
 - Quality is contextual and multifaceted
 - Input
 - Process
 - Output

- II. An innovative and feasible centre plan, including a clear plan for dissemination of knowledge and practices.
 - Vision, strategy and plans + organization
 - The centre's contribution to innovation
 - Framework for evaluation and impact
 - Dissemination of knowledge and practices

Budget

- Open to use any template or format
- Include budget for the center period 2020-2024
- Total SFU budget must include significant own funding

- Budget must
 - Be clearly linked to the centre plan
 - reflect the level of ambition and activity in the centre

- Identify budget information for awarded funds
- In addition: 1-page explanation of costs



Application



An SFU application must include:

- Completed application form in Espresso
- Centre proposal, maximum 12 pages.
- Appendices:
 - A list of references.
 - Budget for the five-year period 2020-2024, including explanation
 - Brief statements from the institutional leadership of the host institution and any consortium partners.
 - CVs of the proposed centre leader and two to five key members of the centre team. Each CV must not exceed two pages.
- Centre proposal and appendices uploaded as single file in Espresso
